Data

- In 2016-17 there were 6,897 visits, up from 4,198 visits in 2015-16 – a 64% increase.
- In 2017-18 there have been 14,915 visits – approximately 1,100 visits a week.
- In 2017-18 there have been 1,244 college applications completed, up from 399 in 2016-17.

Background

- 2012 – 2015
 - Two centers open funded by Great Lakes.
- 2016 – 2017
 - North Center moved to school-based model at Obama SCTE.
 - Centers opened Madison HS and Washington HS.
 - South Center moved to South HS.
 - TEAM UP College Access Center name changed to College and Career Centers.
 - GE Foundation funds two centers.
- 2017-2018
 - Centers opened in 20 high schools.
 - GE Foundation funds six centers.

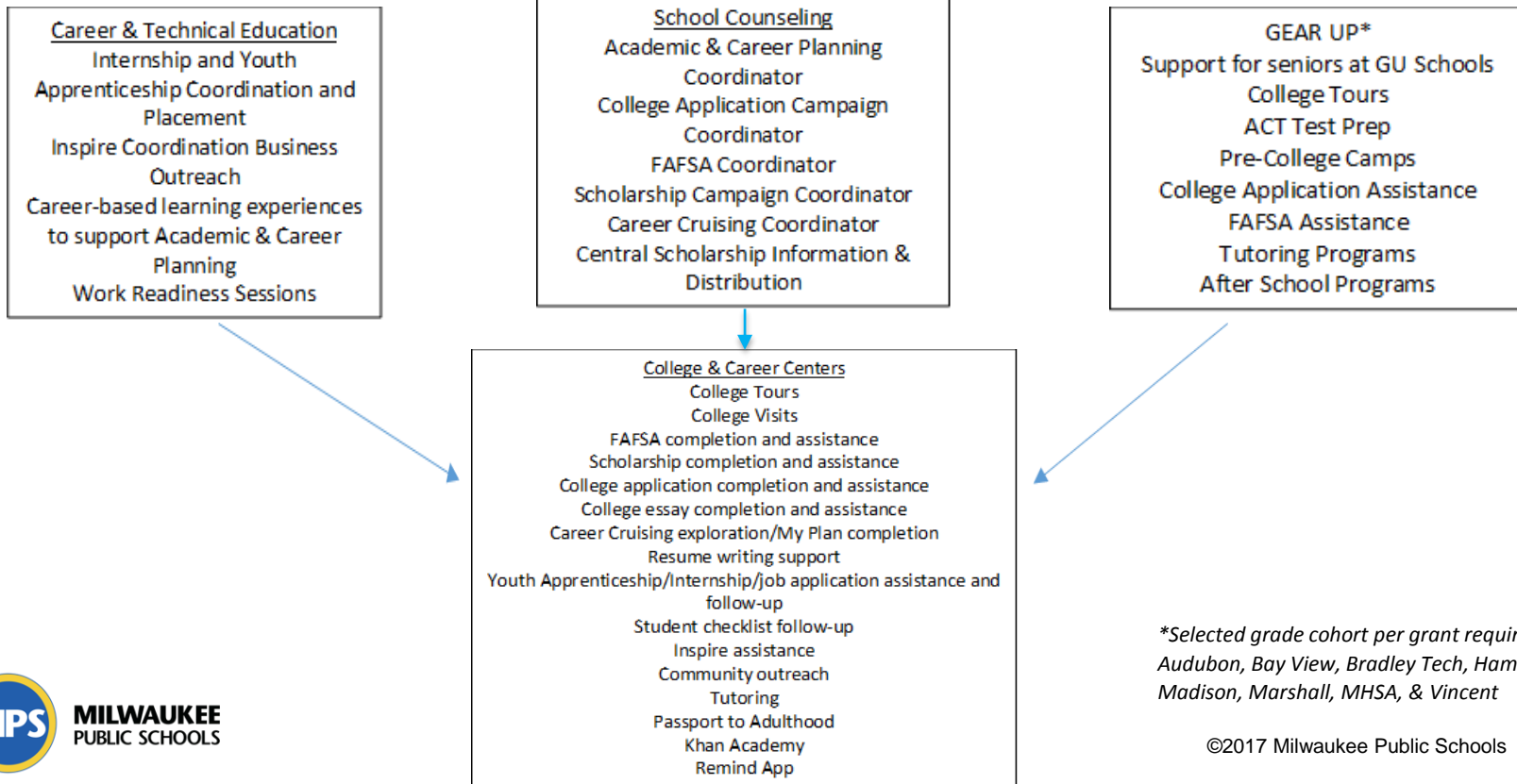


Purpose
