




Parents: Grade Level of their Children




Parents: When should schools reopen?




Students: Grade Level




Students: When should schools reopen?




Parents: How Comfortable are you returning to a school building?




Students: How Comfortable are you returning to a school building?






Communications: Satisfaction with District Leadership





Overall all respondents reported all items as being important in general.

- 90% or greater of respondents indicated it was very important to:
 - School being cleaned thoroughly at least 1 once per day
 - Wash hands regularly
 - Hand sanitizer is provided in each classroom and frequently used
- All other items were at least 60% or greater rated as very important including:
 - Students and staff temperature checks
 - Limiting visitors on campus
 - Students and staff in school and on buses wearing masks


Example of Recommended Expectation

Grade Levels	Synchronous Learning	Asynchronous Learning
PreK - K	45 minutes	2 hours
K5 - 1st Grade	1 hour	3 hours
2nd - 5th Grade	1.5 hours	3.5 hours
6th - 8th Grade	2 hours	4 hours
9th - 12th Grade	3 hours	4 hours



Scenario 2 – Hybrid (Option 1)

Remote/at-home virtual learning and in-classroom instruction

Elementary students will attend school face-to-face.





Scenario 3 – Face-to-Face (Virtual Option)



Students will be back in school with face-to-face instruction. There will be an option for virtual learning.





Health and Safety Protocols

Building and Safety Measures

• Ensure all buildings have accurate supplies, cleaning of high touch surfaces, implement social distancing measures, handwashing/sanitizing.

Preventative Measures

- Limit nonessential visitors access to MPS buildings.
- Educate students, families and staff regarding healthy behaviors.

Risk Mitigation Measures

- Monitor for signs of COVID-19 symptoms.
- Exclude individuals showing symptoms.





MPS Standard of Care

- Build positive relationships with students and families.
- Know what each student needs in each content area.
- Conduct formative assessments regularly.
- Differentiate instruction for students.
- Instruct students at or above grade level.
- Utilize scaffolding for students above and below grade level.
- Design instruction using the content standards.
- Use district adopted/endorsed materials during instruction.
- Center learning around student interests, voice and choice.
- Design learning experiences for students that are inquiry-based.







What We Recommend

- Phased In School Reopening
 - Phase 1: Full Remote Learning
 - Phase 2: Hybrid Learning
 - Phase 3: Face-to-Face Learning

The movement from one phase to the next will be dependent on monitoring the spread of COVID-19 as well as health and safety guidance.



Full Remote Learning

- Maintain the early start (August 17) and traditional start (September 1) calendars for virtual learning.
- No students in school buildings.
- All instruction will be virtual.



Hybrid Learning

- Students will attend school for face-to-face instruction for two days each week.
- Students will learn outside of school virtually for three days each week.
- Students will rotate between face-to-face and virtual instruction.



Face-to-Face Learning

- Students will return to school for in-person instruction pending further health and safety guidance.
- A virtual option will be available.
