Intent (required):

Accelerating Learning/Facilities & Maintenance/Extra-Curricular Activities:

Similar to other school which have been cited as turn-around schools (i.e. Bradley Technical School, Pulaski), funding should be allocated to both, Washington High School and North Division High School to establish an education commission to support the development of the school/community relations, assisting with the development of Strategic Education plans to implement school improvement plans, and assist with recruitment/retention and legacy

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Administration Response:

The reduction of \$100,000 to the hiring of recreation project coordinator LTE to support the overall ESSER program would mean project management of ESSER III for Extracurricular Engagement would have to be absorbed by limited internal resources.

Washington and North currently already have a community school coordinator (full-time). The duties of this position are closely aligned to the functions described above for the commission development specialist.

A community school coordinator, on average, receives a salary of \$70,000 (\$37,520 in fringe benefits). Budgeting for two community school coordinators, would be a total of \$430,080 over two years (\$280,000 in salaries; \$150,080 in fringe benefits).

The Administration does not recommend this amendment, given the community school coordinators currently staffed at Washington and North. However, if the amendment moves forward, the Administration recommends that \$100,000 be taken from the assessment alignment line (page 13).
