Administration Response:

Due to budget constraints in previous years, many high school extra-curricular clubs, programs, and activities were reduced. The afterschool component adds to the overall high school student's experience and assists in improving the overall academic achievement, health and wellness of students by providing constructive activities during non-school hours in a supervised environment.

Extra-curricular clubs promote fitness, creativity, and serve as a positive outlet for students. Students can explore different interests that may provide an access point for students to engage with college and career opportunities beyond the K12 experience.

Page 4 of the ESSER II budget detail is direct services for students. This amendment would reduce a direct service such as tutoring, for another direct service for students, namely after school clubs. The administration agrees with the amendment but would recommend taking the funding from page 7 of the ESSER II Budget Detail set aside for professional development.
