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Administration Response:

There are twenty-six (26) early start schools that do not have air conditioning for the entire building. These schools have a total of about 1,563 classrooms. Each school presents different considerations concerning installing air conditioning such as year built, type of building construction, type/condition of existing mechanical system and type of building design adopted with building code.

In a classroom setting, window air conditioning units are extremely noisy and cause unwanted cold drafts. Units have limited cool air distribution depending on the size of the room and will require additional units to adequately cool the space. During the cooling season, existing ventilation pathways need to be blocked off. There are additional costs associated with window air conditioning unit upkeep such as blocking ventilation pathways and repairs. Lastly, the units do not provide the code required amount of outside air for spaces that are the size of classrooms.

To estimated cost to purchase and install a window air conditioning unit is estimated at \$5,000 per unit. The units need to be installed on metal fabricated stands within the existing window assembly system and requires a dedicated electrical outlet. The additional electrical loads needed for a building will add additional costs. An estimate of total cost would be on average 2.5 units per classroom X \$5,000 (average cost of \$750 per unit with installation) X 1,563 classrooms would be a total of \$19,537,500.

Based on the intent above, fan cost for a premium unit at \$300 each for 1,563 classrooms comes to \$468,900.

The administration recommends using the \$300,000 indicated in the amendment for the purchase of premium fans for the early start schools.
