


To better understand future enrollment projections, the following need to be evaluated:

- Geospatial distribution




MPS Enrollment by Grade Type

Enrollment loss is largely being driven by elementary aged students, which may indicate further enrollment loss in the future as cohorts matriculate through the grades.



MPS Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

Like many urban school districts, MPS has been experiencing enrollment loss over the last 10 years, especially in black and white student enrollment.





Fig.4.4 Public School Utilization by Ward, SY22-23






Program Distribution Analysis


Mapping and analyzing academic programs across MPS will allow us to better understand the geographic distribution of programs and help MPS ensure there is equitable access to programs now and in the future.


Washington DC: Access to programs by Ward




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


