US Postmaster meter postage is used to fund MPS's permit imprint, which is a preprint that is overlaid on district mailings and referenced at USPS facilities when weighing and delivering. US Postal Service meter postage is used to fund our internal mailroom equipment when MPS weighs and meters mail being processed for distribution.

The total cost of goods purchased from the US Postal Service will not exceed \$400,000. The total cost of goods purchased from the US Postmaster will not exceed \$300,000.

Authorization to Enter into a Contract with GPS Education Partners, Inc. for **Alternative Education Programming**

The Administration is requesting authorization to enter into a contract with GPS Education Partners, Inc. (GPS) for alternative education programming. This contractor provides enrollment for up to 22 MPS students in grades 11 and 12 to participate in the Second Chance Partners for Education Youth Apprenticeship program.

Students participating in this immersive, work-based program will be given the opportunity to earn a high school diploma from MPS while preparing for potential career pathways in manufacturing and further education. GPS and MPS will work together to identify, recruit, and select students that meet GPS administration requirements and timetables.

This contract will run from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, (the "Initial Term"), with two possible additional one-year options to extend.

The total cost of the Contract in the Initial Term will not exceed \$143,000.

Exception Authorization to Extend a Contract with City Year, Inc. to Serve as a Core Site for Whole School, Whole Child Support

The Administration is requesting authorization to extend the contract with City Year, Inc. ("City Year") to implement City Year's research-based Whole School, Whole Child service model (WSWC). City Year recruits, prepares and leads diverse AmeriCorps members aged, 17 to 24, for 10 months of full-time service in schools as near peer tutors, mentors and role models to help students stay on track to graduation. Corps Members are placed in specific, mutually agreed-upon schools within the District to serve in conjunction with school staff and members of the school community to help improve student attendance, behavior and coursework through academic support, attendance monitoring and incentives, positive behavior support, extended day programming and school-wide programs and events. Services are provided to a caseload of students who are failing or off-track in the areas of attendance, behavior, and course performance, specifically in the content areas of literacy and math.

City Year has been providing services to MPS since 2013. School deployment and team size have been determined based on school enrollment and district wide-feeder patterns to ensure fidelity to the WSWC model and City Year's long-term Impact Goal. Annually, school deployment and team size are reviewed to determine if City Year will deploy teams of corps members to additional schools or add corps members to schools in order to maximize student impact. Previously, teams of 8 - 10 corps members have implemented WSWC in 11 MPS schools. Two additional schools, Harold S. Vincent High School and Casimir Pulaski High School, have been added for the 2017 - 2018 school year. Additionally, a second team has been added to Alexander Mitchell Integrated Arts School.

From July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018, City Year will serve the following schools: Rogers Street Academy; Alexander Mitchell Integrated Arts School (2 teams); Roosevelt Creative Arts Middle School; Hopkins Lloyd Community School; Dr. George Washington Carver Academy of Mathematics and Science; South Division High School; Rufus King International School - Middle Years Campus; Bay View High School; Barack Obama School of Career and Technical Education; Clarke Street School; James Madison Academic Campus; Harold S. Vincent High School; and Casimir Pulaski High School. To ensure commitment to the WSWC model, MPS and City Year have included a 'Statement of Partnership' for acknowledgement by each partner school principal.

The original contract provided for two one-year options to extend if certain performance metrics were met. City Year met the performance metrics codified in the contract; therefore, MPS is exercising the first option year for the contract.

The total cost of the contract will not exceed \$1,499,999.90 in this extension term.

Authorization to Extend a Contract with Cooperative Educational Service Agency #1 Exception for Personalized Learning Facilitation and Support

The Administration is requesting authorization to extend a contract with Cooperative Educational Service Agency #1 (CESA) for facilitation and support in the implementation of Personalized Learning at the following ten schools: Eighty-First Street School; Lowell P. Goodrich School; Hi-Mount Community School; Lincoln Center of the Arts; Milwaukee High School of the Arts; James Madison Academic Campus; Riverside University High School; Rufus King IB High School; Ronald Wilson Reagan College Preparatory High School; and Bay View High School.

Personalized Learning is instruction that offers pedagogy, curriculum and learning environments to meet the individual student's needs. The experience is tailored to learning preferences and the specific interests of different learners. This program was implemented last year in four schools and is being expanded in this extension year to six more. CESA provides: project management; coordination and consulting services; and professional development for educators.

This contract extension will run from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. The total cost of the contract in this extension year will not exceed \$79,190.

The Administration is requesting authorization to enter into a contract with United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County (UW) to provide services in the development and implementation of the Community Schools model. The schools to be serviced under this contract in the 2017-18 school year are: Auer Avenue School; Hopkins-Lloyd School; Lynde and Harry Bradley Technology and Trade School; James Madison Academic Campus; Lincoln Avenue School; Browning School; South Division High School; and one additional school still to be selected.

Community Schools are a strategy to better engage and align resources centers on the self-identified, real-time needs of communities. This strategy places the focus on the whole child, with the understanding that a child belongs to a family, and that family lives and interacts within a larger community. UW will serve in two capacities pursuant to this contract: 1) as a backbone partner for the Milwaukee Community Schools Partnership (MCSP); and 2) as a lead agency for schools within the MCSP that do not otherwise have a lead agency designated.

This contract will run from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, (the "Initial Term"), with two possible additional one-year options to extend.

The total cost of the Contract in the Initial Term will not exceed \$350,000. These board funds do not cover the full cost of the project; MPS and UW will partner to apply for relevant government, foundation and corporate support.
