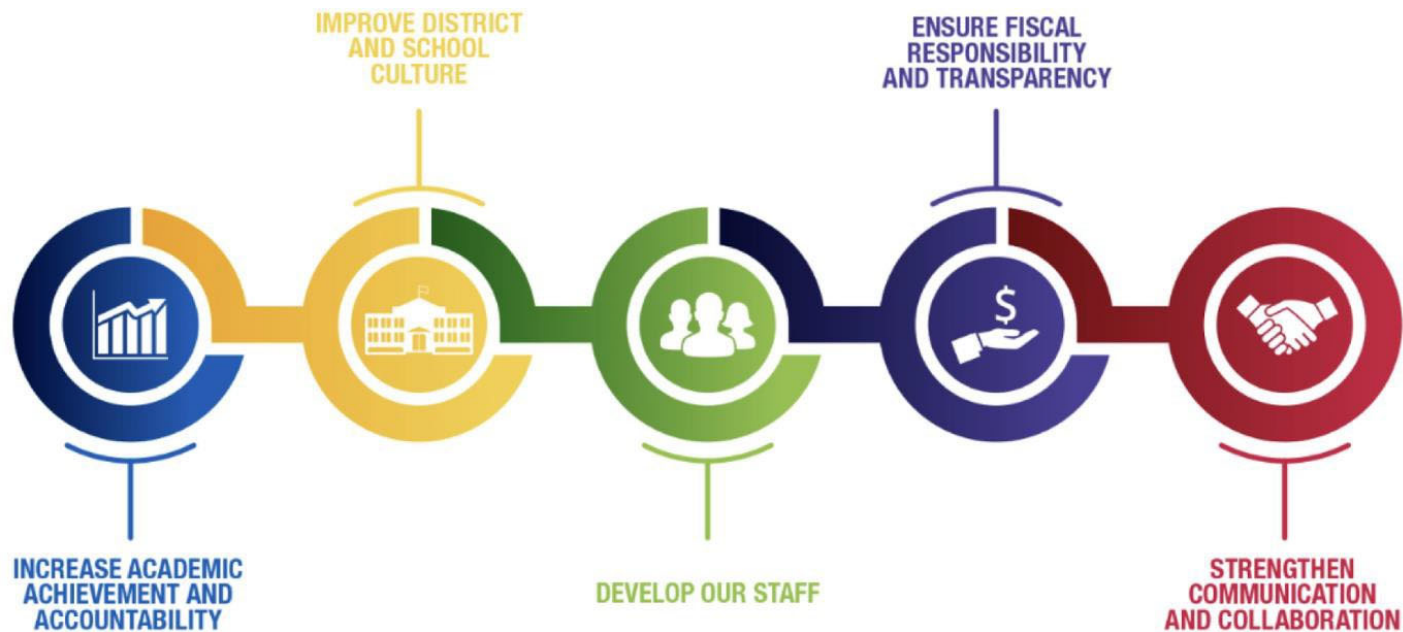

# Resolution 2223R - 006 Expectations

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- Unannounced walkthroughs of randomly selected school buildings to audit building security, documenting any potential risks for intrusion from outsiders or other physical school safety concerns;
- Analysis of building-level security, emergency and/or crisis response policies and procedures, with a focus on policies and procedures related to preventing and responding to violent incidents on school grounds;
- Assessment of the content, frequency, participation and quality of school safety trainings conducted by schools and the central office



# Project Cost and Timeline

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- Work to begin in January with an April completion
- Presentation to the Milwaukee Board of School Directors by Executive Director
- Analysts will be available for telephone conference calls and emails.
- Written Analysis and Final Version Report
- Cost for 154 MPS schools and support facilities \$799,948.00
