PPG INDUSTRIES	PPG Grant (Bradley Tech)	5,000	The grant will help fund manufacturing educational signage for the new green parking lot being built at Bradley Tech.
Lowe's Char and Ed Found	Lowe's Toolbox for Education (MHSA)	5,000	This grant will help revamp the art room at MHSA by providing more storage and mass production printing equipment.
Lowe's Char and Ed Found	Lowe's Toolbox for Education (La Causa)	5,000	This grant will be used to purchase computer monitors needed for classrooms. Over 800 students use these computers daily for learning and building skills in core subjects.
Dollar General	Dollar General Literacy (Extended Learning)	2,000	This grant will provide high-interest books for approximately 120 second grade students participating in the MPS Summer Academy program. These books will be aligned to the Summer Academy grade-level curriculum, and there will be Spanish-language offerings for bilingual students. The book topics will also be tied to a field trip or hands-on STEM activity so that students can make real-world connections to their learning. This program will target new readers and/or readers who are below grade level. This would provide more opportunities for students to read during the summer months.
WI Department of Child & Family Services	Refugee Impact Grant (Bilingual Multicultural Education)	85,400	This grant will provide funding for high schools to enhance current activities around engaging refugee youth. The English as a Second Language district staff will partner with high school English as a Second Language teachers to develop the opportunity for high school staff to mentor refugee youth. The funding will allow staff and students to identify educational and career related skills that need development. Mentors and mentees may take field trips, build resumes, discuss health and financial literacy, and social skills. The funding also allows for tutoring and the acquisition of tools such as Chromebooks for students to use to study and explore job opportunities.
WI Department of Child & Family Services	Refugee Youth Mentoring (Bilingual Multicultural Education)	45,520	This grant will provide a Newcomer English Learner Summer School. English as a Second Language staff will collaborate with the Extended Learning Opportunities staff to develop this unique summer opportunity for refugee students in grades K-8. The focus will be on accelerating literacy skills and bridging home/community to school through communication skills. This activity aligns to the district's goals for Ambitious Instruction. A second goal of the project is to partner with the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee to cover tuition and costs for a textbook for district staff to take a course in parent engagement. The course is focused on ways to interact and engage with refugee parents and communities.
Milw Metro Sewerage Dist	Green Infrastructure Partnership Program (Rec)	119,508	This grant will focus on implementing improvements identified in Milwaukee Receptions Master Plan for Burnham Park with a green infrastructure component. This project will incorporate green infrastructure components to the asphalt, tot lot and wading pool areas. Green infrastructure strategies for this project may include the removal of asphalt paving and the installation of permeable paving, as well as the planting of trees that can hold rainwater. This project will improve the recreation experience, help manage our urban sewer system, and protect the environment.
