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Building off existing processes for organizing student and staff contact lists. We will use the exact ESCC questions from previous years, to allow longitudinal analysis of results. Merge the ESCC staff survey with the Wisconsin Educator Development Support and Retention survey (WEDSR). The WEDSR is a mandated part of the Wisconsin Educator Effectiveness System. Combining the surveys will greatly reduce educator survey fatigue. Revise the existing Qualtrics surveys according to new capabilities developed by Qualtrics. One specific function that will be used is "Loop and Merge". This will allow MPS staff to complete the school-specific components of their survey for all schools or building for which they work. In previous administrations, staff were only able to provide feedback about one school, regardless of how many they worked within.

Offer the student survey in both English and Spanish. Set up dashboards that will allow MPS to track response rates for each school in real time. Send out reminder emails to staff, following the direction of MPS. Create a new UDISP.COM dashboard. This dashboard is currently being built to house WEDSR survey data. MPS will not have access to the WEDSR dashboard because it did not participate in the WEDSR at a high enough level last year. We will still be able to leverage the infrastructure of this dashboard for the ESCC. The dashboard will provide MPS protected access the ESCC results. The dashboard will allow users to filter data by staff and student characteristics, such as by race (staff and student), gender (staff and student), grade level (student), and education (staff). We will work with MPS to identify the factors they would like included. We will participate in any trainings for MPS staff to use the dashboard.
