Dual enrollment/dual credit is when high school students earn both college and high school credit at the same time through a single class. The credit can be for a graduation requirement or an elective credit. Dual enrollment is recognized by the U.S. Department of Education What Works Clearinghouse as having positive effects on the completion of high school, college access and enrollment, credit accumulation, and students' degree attainment.
