This contract is not to exceed \$34000. The contractor (Wisconsin Center for Education Research) agrees to serve as an external evaluator for the creation of evaluation reports for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 academic school years. In accordance with DPI evaluation report criteria, the contractor will conduct an analysis of student level data comparing CLC attendees to non-CLC attenders. Data to be analyzed includes attendance, academics, student and family demographics, and behavioral outcomes. If possible, a test for significance between the groups will be conducted. Services will include phone interviews with CLC site directors based on an interview protocol Jointly designed with the MPS Recreation CLC team to identify key questions of interest around program successes, challenges, and recommendations for the future. Services will also include review and analysis of 21st Century Community Learning Center local goals submitted by CLC sites for the 2020-21-and 2021-22 school years for goal progress and to ensure goals are measurable, attainable, and have readily available data source identified. The contractor agrees to draft a final report, including individual site-level analysis and a district level summary of all programs. The MPS Recreation Department will have a minimum of two weeks' notice to review a draft report. The contractor agrees to present the final report at a virtual or in person meeting with the MPS Recreation and Research, Assessment, and Data Departments.
