Overview

Purpose of Local Purchasing Programs

Increase local business participation in the award of competitive procurements to address the following:

- Job creation
- Circulate money in the local economy
- Alleviate unemployment




What if analysis MPS RFPs

Parameters

- 5% additional points incentive for local business enterprise
- 10% additional points incentive for local business enterprise and Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) enterprise




Fiscal Year Comparison of Respondents






Fiscal Year Comparison for Contract Awards






Disaggregation of Local Contract Award via RFP








Local Awarded Company Demographics

RFP Incentive Outcome

- Local business enterprises would have resulted in 23 firms receiving 5% additional points, but no award outcome change
- Local and HUB enterprise would have resulted in five firms receiving 10% additional points, and one (1) award outcome change based on points




What if Analysis MPS Bids

Parameters

- 5% bid incentive for local business enterprise, incentive capped at \$25,000
- 10% bid incentive for local business enterprise and Historically Underutilized Business (HUB), incentive capped at \$30,000



Fiscal Year Comparison of Respondents






Fiscal Year Comparison for Contract Awards






Disaggregation of Local Contract Award via Bid







Non-Local Awarded Company Demographics






TOTAL NUMBER

Bid Incentive Outcome

- Local business enterprise resulted in one firm receiving 5%, no impact on award outcome
- Local and HUB enterprise resulted in one firm receiving 10%, no impact on award outcome



Limitations

- Like City of Madison and Milwaukee local purchasing program revealed little change in award outcome
- State law prohibits local requirements on public works
- Federally funded programs are also exempt
- Auditing of program
- Race, gender, and resident tracking
- Potential policy development/updates steps



Parameters to Maintain Consistent Quality

- Evaluation committee consistency
 - Educate district sponsors and evaluation committees on the purpose of the program
 - Reemphasize scope writing and specification drafting
- Incentive points to be allocated by Procurement
 - Evaluation committees not involved



Findings and Considerations

- Consistent participation of local bidders
- Capacity of respondents may be a limitation
- Fiscal impact would be minimal
- Approval of current 10-point allowance to percentage of total points
- Industry best practices
