- Improve safety and security
- Beyond law enforcement officer



- #1 Roles and Expectations
- Should be clearly defined and understood
- Codified in IGA, procedures, and administrative handbooks
- Officers and school leaders on same page



#2 – SRO Selection Process

- Roles understood; specialized position
- Recruit and select process
- Broad participation
- Unique temperament and skillset



#3 – SRO Training

- As recipients and providers
- Multi-disciplinary—joint training
- Major issue: Clarifying roles
- Annual review



#4 – Community Engagement

- Safer school and community—everybody's business
- Communications about what SROs do
- Positive interactions
- Referrals to diversion programs and resources



#5 – Monitoring

- Tracking SRO activities
- Capture the work done and work desired
- Reviews and lessons learned



#6 – Deployment

- Examine current practice
- Flexibility and consistency
- Prioritization and scheduling
