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Article 8. The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized:

- This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational. and scientific purposed, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be (b) distributable to its officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein.
- No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of (c) propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
- Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article 9. Dissolution: Distribution of Assets

Upon dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be allocated to pay outstanding (e) liabilities or obligations of the corporation, or distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax law, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose, in accordance with section 181.51, Wisconsin Statutes. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or STATE OF WISCONSIN organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated

exclusively for such purposes.

Article 10. Nondiscrimination Policy

Carmen High School of Science and Technology, Inc. and any school operated by Carmen High School of Science and Technology, Inc., shall admit students of any race, color, national origin, and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. 
