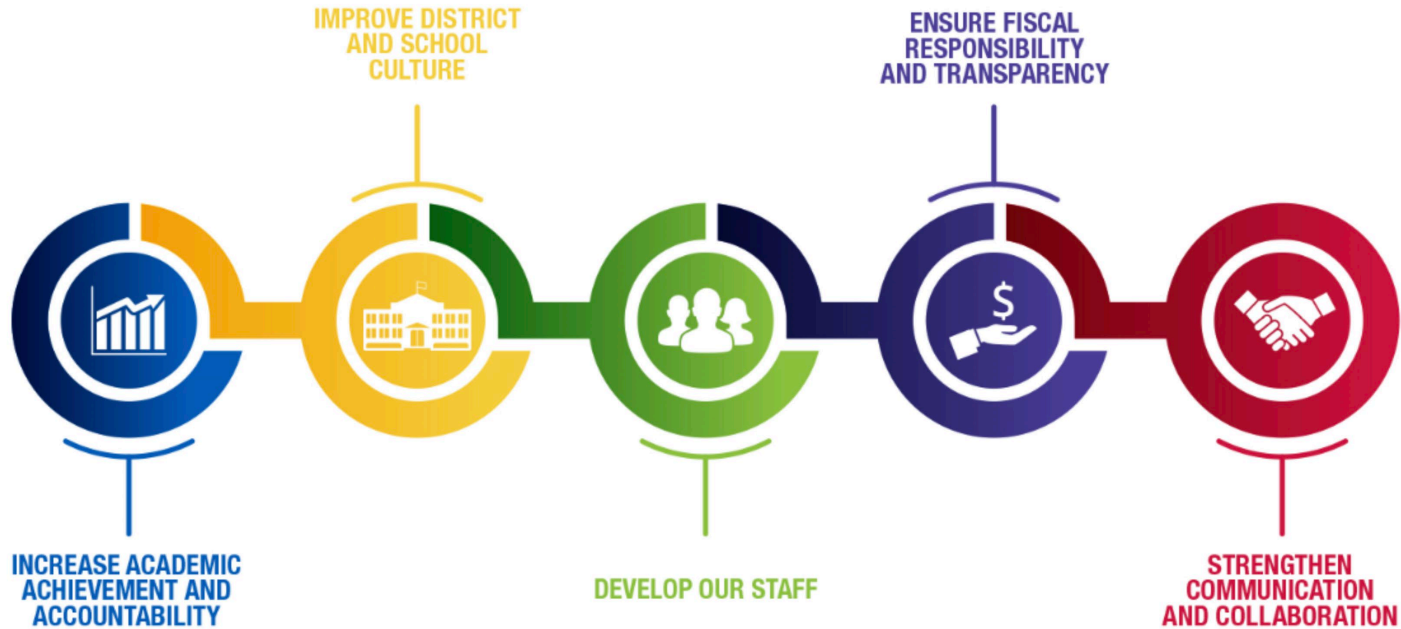

- Explained to students why we had to switch to pre-pack meals service
- Updated students on staffing and supply chain issues
- Shared with students what we are doing to transition kitchens back to being production kitchens

# Moving Forward

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- Hired a chef to participate in developing/improving menus and to train kitchen staff on culinary skills
- The chef will incorporate student feedback when developing/improving menus and recipes
- Approximately 15 food service manager trainees are currently going through our training program
