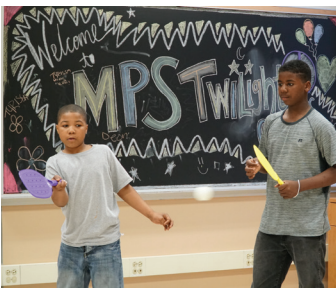

# BY THE NUMBERS

## Partnerships

- Partnered with **8** agencies and **8** playground locations playground locations to engage youth in the Summer Stars league component of the Twilight Program.
- Partnered with **9** agencies to launch the Midnight Sports League in March of 2017.
- Partnered with **12** community health groups and **10** MPS Departments for MPS C.A.R.E.S. Wellness Days.
  - E.g. Susan G. Komen, Froedtert & the Medical College of WI, Aurora Health Care, American Heart Association, and the American Lung Association.
- Partnered with MPS's Nutrition Services to provide healthy snacks during Twilight programming.
- Partnered with Milwaukee Police Department to provide a safe environment at the Midnight Sports League.

## Outreach

- Opened **3** Twilight Centers on October 31, 2016 (North, South, and Washington).
- Opened **3** additional Twilight Centers on February 19, 2017 (Obama, Madison, Bay View).
- Opened the **7**th site, Pulaski High School Twilight Center, on June 19, 2017.
- Providing bus transportation home at North Division and Bay View High Schools.

## Grants and Funding

- Received **\$29,000** Community Advocates Grant to help purchase supplies for all Twilight Centers.
- Received **\$30,000** Hunger Task Force Grant to purchase equipment at out-of-school-time meal locations.
- Received **\$10,000** from the City of Milwaukee to develop enrichment programming during the Midnight Sports League.

## Enrichment

- Provided **8** enrichment workshops at **4** Twilight Center sites for Summer Stars league participants, which served over **480** youth.
- Providing **12** enrichment programs during Twilight Center Hours. Programs include sessions by Muhibb Dyer, Khalil Coleman, and Tina Nixon. Additionally, participants will be introduced to cooking instruction, digital music production, Artist Working in Education programming, and an intramural sports program.
- Providing Midnight Sports League participants with enrichment programming by America Works, Department of Employee Relations, City of Milwaukee, and University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
- Offering to the community a core group of activities including Yoga, Tai Chi, Tae Kwon Do, and Zumba via Wellness Days.

## Participation Numbers

- Over **87,500** recorded visits to the 7 Twilight Centers.
- **2,550** registered participants ages 12-18 in the Twilight Program.
- **567** is the highest single site attendance for Twilight Centers (South Division).
- **1,310** is the highest single night attendance across all Twilight Centers.
- Over **500** community participants for monthly Wellness Days.
- Over **300** registered participants in the Midnight Sports League basketball program.
- Engaged **1,008** teens in the Summer Stars League, a summer component of the Twilight Program.
  - A total of **48** teams participated in basketball league, including an all-time record of **16** girls' teams.
  - **20** soccer teams competed in the league at South Stadium.

## Employment Numbers

- Created **150** new part-time jobs to service the Twilight Centers and the Midnight League.
  - 265 individual hires to support the C.A.R.E.S. since inception.
- Created **10** new part-time jobs through Wellness Days events.
