- Programs include academics, social-emotional learning, career development, and health and wellness

2017 Summer Data

Attendance

- 4,844 students attended all programs
- 27.5% increase in high school
- 10.8% increase overall

High School

- 1,147 ($\frac{1}{2}$ credits) credits recovered
- 839 ONL-SER-COM requirements met
- 241 summer graduates
- 2,298 participants in Freshman Bridge

Program Length: 2 days
