#### Amendment # 010 - Woodward

### Administration Response:

Before- and after-school programs

The following list of programs are offered in the schools listed below.

- Community Learning Centers (CLCs): Auer, Bethune, Clarke, Hopkins Lloyd, North Division, Siefert, Washington, and Westside
- Safe Place: Brown, Jackson, Keefe, LaFollette, Milwaukee High School of the Arts, and Story
- Camp (offer before- and after-school): Elm, Hawley, and Starms Early Childhood
- Boys and Girls Club: Metcalfe

All schools in District 4 have after-school programs with the exception of Andrew Douglas, Milwaukee Academy of Chinese Language, Roosevelt, and Starms Discovery. The approximate cost to provide these services would be \$364,000. In order to offer before-school programs to the schools in District 4, the approximate cost would be \$220,640.

In order to implement the proposed amendment, extensive operational transportation changes would need to occur.
