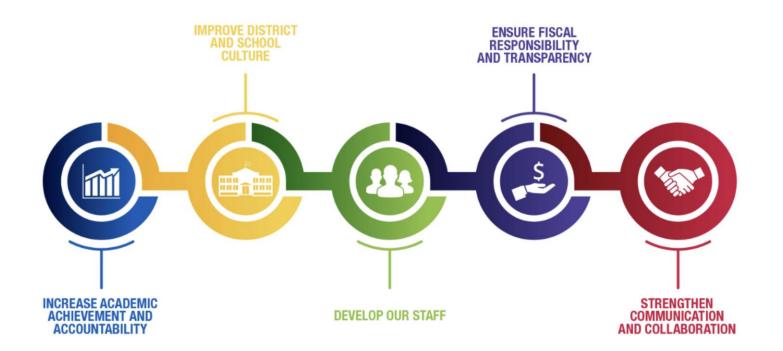






#### **Early Childhood Demographics**
