



Vision Statement

River Trail School will create a learner focused academic and mosaic of arts encompassing community services, agriculture, and technology. Historical Background

- First school in the state to receive AHA learning garden gift.
- Completed phase two of plan with composting of student food
- Created a three sisters pumpkin patch including: pumpkins, corn and beans
- Purchased three indoor greenhouses and two outdoor greenhouses
- Received through a grant hydroponics towers
- Started a 4-H Club
- Feeder school for Vincent's agriculture program



SWALES

WE PROPOSE:

- Cut swales to contour 30 feet apart, all the way down the slope to the street
- Plant trees behind the swales
- If possible, graze the swaths between the swales
- Sell all products to reinvest in the soil




FIGURE 6.4 Trees planted off swale bank to take advantage of wet-season water.

Estimated Income

From plants alone, no annual crops:

Chestnuts: \$ 7,500

Pears: \$24,000

Hazelnuts \$13,000

Projected profit/year \$ 44,500


Note: estimated income will support future expansion
